





Chapter 1: The Beginning



It was a warm summer night in 1954. I remember my mother saying grandma called home to tell one of her brothers to meet her halfway in the park on her way home from work. He never made it to the park, or either he was too slow. My mom never could remember what delayed him, but he had wished a many days that he would have left as soon as she called. Maybe she would still be alive today...or maybe not.

She was stabbed three times by her ex-boyfriend. My mom said she always knew he would kill her one day, but she thought it would be from the multiple beatings he gave her every weekend. It seems as if every time he got drunk, he'd find another reason to beat her over and over again. She and her brothers swore one day they would kill him.

My grandmother left behind four sons and one daughter, Lena, my mother. They were split up. My mom was sent one place and my uncles were sent to four different places. Back then, you went wherever someone would feed you. It didn't matter if they were kin or not. Sadly, they never saw each other again, which started what I call a generational curse.

I was born in April of 1959. My mother had just turned 18. I was the fifth of five children. My mother had a child just



about every year. I was considered special because I was the only surviving son. My mother had her first son, my older brother, when she was fourteen. He died when he was 2 months old – from pneumonia they said. After that, she only had her three daughters and me to take care of, and I required a lot of care. I was born **blind with a severe case** of cataracts. My mother said I stayed in the hospital for months **before** the doctors would let me come home. As I got older, the cataracts got worse.

I could remember as early as age three, people asking my mom “who is his dad?” My mother either didn’t know or she just didn’t want to tell because she would always change the subject by saying “God is his daddy, now let it be.”

I was born with light brown eyes and blue circles around my pupils. They were crossed very bad and my skin was a pale olive color. In those days, the insurance men were white and they would come to your house and pick up your payment. If you didn’t have the money, he would get his payment another way. I don’t have to spell it out. You know what I mean.
